

Adviser Checklist - Establishing whether a European National has the Right to Reside in the UK

- 1. Which nationality
- 2. Details of family member including their nationality, economic activity and details of support provided from family
- 3. Length of time in the UK and details of any temporary absences and reasons (absences of a maximum of 12 months for important reasons such as pregnancy, childbirth, serious illness, etc don't break continuity of residence)
- 4. Reasons for coming to the UK
- 5. Employment and self-employment history
 - the period of employment
 - the number of hours worked
 - the level of earnings
 - whether the work was regular or erratic
 - for self-employed, whether they registered as self-employed with HMRC, advertised their business, etc
- 6. If unemployed, was it involuntary unemployment, or due to illness/accident at work
- 7. Details of any health problems, any accident at work or an occupational disease which resulted incapacity to work
- 8. For JSA claimants, after 6 months of claiming, what efforts they have made to find work and whether they have a genuine prospect of finding work in the UK
- 9. Details of children's education ("general education") and whether parents have previously been a worker while the child was in the UK and child would not be able to continue their education if parent had to leave the UK.
- 10. For students and self-sufficient person whether they have comprehensive sickness insurance for themselves and their family
