3. Benefit Updates

Universal Credit

The taper rate that applies to earnings in Universal Credit will be reduced from 63% to 55%

- The work allowance will increased by £500 a year for households with children or where a household member has limited capability for work
- The temporary increase in the surplus earnings threshold to £2,500 will continue until April 2023 when it will be reduced to £300.
- These changes should be introduced by 1 December 2021.

Extension to coronavirus related provisions ESA: those affected by coronavirus and who meet other eligibility conditions can continue to be treated as having limited capability for work for ESA without submitting a fit note

Independent Case Examiner (ICE) reports 'steady stream' of cases where claimants are misadvised by the DWP to claim Universal Credit (UC)

End of working tax credit 'working hours' easement

An easement for Working Tax Credit (WTC), which allows claimants whose working hours are reduced due to coronavirus to be treated as working their normal hours, will be lifted from 25 November 2021.

Post Office card accounts HMRC has <u>confirmed</u> it will no longer make tax credit or child benefit payments into Post Office card accounts from 30 November 2021.

Upper Tribunal decision - engaging with others (Personal Independence Payment (PIP) - activity 9) CPIP/1627/2020 is a helpful Upper Tribunal decision for claimants who can engage with others but only in a certain setting. The claimant was on the autistic spectrum. There was evidence they could engage with others when visiting a Warhammer shop and participating in gaming events. The First-tier Tribunal (FTT) concluded that they could socialise adequately. The Upper Tribunal allowed the claimant's appeal finding that the FTT had placed too much weight on evidence of what the claimant could do. They had failed to consider whether the claimant was capable of engaging with people more generally. Advisers will find this decision helpful in challenging decisions where a claimant has problems engaging with others but has been denied points under PIP activity 9 because they can manage the activity in specific circumstances.
