3. <u>Benefit Updates (Citizens Advice / CPAG /LASA / Benefits and</u> Work updates summary)

Future changes to disability benefit The government is proposing to abolish the Work Capability Assessment and to make all disability support in the benefits system rely on the PIP assessment instead. This won't happen until 2026/27 at the earliest.

Reminder of change to bereavement benefits for cohabiting couples with children

Benefit rules now allow bereavement support to co-habiting partners (where previously it was only for those who were married or in a civil partnership). The government has agreed to allow retrospective claims back to 2018 but people only have until Feb 2024 to make retrospective claims. Approximately 21,000 potential claims could be made in the UK - the government website:

- ➤ In March 2022 the <u>Healthy Start programme</u> changed, existing and new eligible residents have to re-apply online to receive their Healthy start card. Before the transition 73% of eligible residents in Tower Hamlets were using healthy start

To be eligible for the £301 payment you will need to have been in receipt of one of the following benefits during the qualifying period:

- Universal Credit
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support
- Working Tax Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Pension Credit
