# 3. <u>Benefit Updates (Information from articles produced by Citizens Advice / CPAG /LASA / Benefits and Work updates summary)</u>

➤ Managed migration The DWP have announced an intention to move more Tax Credit (TC) claimants over to Universal Credit (UC) via managed migration.

From May, East London area will be part of managed migration – we will be finding out more about this at the welfare rights advisors forum (23<sup>rd</sup> May see above). Here is a roundup of

our (DWP) current resources of managed migration: <u>Adviser Online article 'A guide to</u> managed migration' on Medium

Universal Credit will be expanded to more tax credit claimants. From April 2023, more tax credit claimants will be asked to claim Universal Credit (UC) in order to continue to receive the benefit they are entitled to. Households that receive tax credits only will be the first to be asked to make the move to UC. Those affected will receive a letter from DWP notifying them of the action they need to take, and the support available to help them. Where an individual's entitlement to UC would be lower than their legacy benefits entitlement, they may be entitled to a top-up payment known as Transitional Protection. This means that their UC entitlement will be the same as their legacy benefit entitlement at the point they move.

#### > End of life rules change:

Personal Independence Payment (PIP), Attendance Allowance (AA) and Disability Living Allowance (DLA) have now caught up with the already in-force changes to income-related benefits. From Monday 3 April, special rules benefit claims can be brought by those whose death is reasonably to be expected within 12 months (instead of 6 months). The SR1 form has now replaced the DS1500 and GOV.UK guidance to clients, and their medical professionals, has been updated to reflect this.

## DWP guidance on changes to benefit cap limits in Universal Credit (UC)

The new benefit cap rates are:

For couples and lone parents, £22,020 outside London and £25,323 in London For single people without children, £14,753 outside London and £16,967 in London The new rates apply in any UC assessment period beginning on or after 10 April 2023. You can read the guidance on benefit cap limits in ADM Memo 09/23.

#### Upper Tribunal (UT) decision on Tax Credit (TC) finalisations when client claims UC

The UT confirms how income is calculated when a TC award is finalised mid-year due to a UC claim under Regulation 12A Universal Credit (Transitional Provisions) Regulations 2014, which modifies the TC legislation. A 'notional current year's income' must be calculated using the income actually received during the part of the tax year covered by the TC award, rather than using an amount directly attributable to that period. The amount of the notional current year's income will therefore depend on the exact timing of the UC claim. In this case, it was higher than the client's annual income, leading to an overpayment. #### Support for Mortgage Interest loan scheme extended to 200,000

More Universal Credit claimants will be eligible for mortgage help.

They will be able to access help towards mortgage interest on their home or certain home improvements worth up to £200,000. Claimants will be able to receive the support after just three months of being on Universal Credit (previously, and they now do not have to be unemployed to do so. They will also be able to re-claim the support if they leave Universal Credit but return within six months

## Change to Fuel Direct ongoing consumption

From 1 April 2023, energy suppliers can resume requesting new deductions or increases to existing deductions for Fuel Direct ongoing consumption payments but must have the claimant's consent first. For new requests, suppliers must also seek a claimant's consent before the request is sent to DWP. Claimants can request a MR to challenge deductions from benefits.

#### > PIP POINTS FOR OVEREATING
