Bow Foodbank - Community Partner FAQ

Who are we? We are an independent foodbank charity serving the Tower Hamlets community since 2014. Our foodbank is based in Bow and provides immediate, short-term food aid to those in need — no referral required.

Who can access Bow Foodbank?

- Tower Hamlets residents can access food support up to 12 times every 12 months.
- Residents from outside Tower Hamlets can access food support up to 3 times
 every 12 months, after which we will signpost them to services closer to their
 home.
- Asylum seekers, those with no recourse to public funds, and residents living in a refuge can attend weekly without a limit.

What do clients receive? Each visit includes:

- Pre-bagged essential food items
- Fresh fruit and vegetables
- Additional food for families with children (including nappies)
- Household items (subject to availability, e.g., toiletries, cleaning products)
- We have a non-cook food bag option for those without access to a kitchen

When are we open? We offer multiple sessions throughout the week for in-person visits and Click & Collect orders. [Add link or times if needed.]

Is a referral needed? No. We are open to anyone in immediate need of food support — no referral forms, vouchers, or agency paperwork required.

What is Click & Collect? Click & Collect is an alternative way for Tower Hamlets residents to access food from Bow Foodbank. Clients order their food bag online and collect it during dedicated pickup times.

- You must live in Tower Hamlets to use Click & Collect.
- First visit must be in person to register.
- Clients using Click & Collect can choose more options for their bag (e.g., selecting dietary preferences) compared to the standard emergency in-person bag.
- To use Click & Collect, clients must have internet access.
- Orders must be submitted at least 2 days before the collection session.

What else do we offer besides emergency food parcels?

- If a guest needs additional support, we offer access to advice services covering topics such as benefits, energy, and housing.
- We are also working in partnership with other organizations who work in food poverty or provide food aid to support organizations.

How can community partners help?

- Refer clients who would benefit from immediate food aid.
- Help clients understand visit limits based on their residency status.
- Signpost Tower Hamlets residents to Bow Foodbank directly.
- For non-Tower Hamlets residents, encourage clients to access their three annual visits and then connect with local services.
